Acts 4:1-22 — Peter and John are arrested and told not to preach.

Acts 4:20 – "We can't help but talk about what we've seen and heard."

Acts 4:23-31 – James and John give their report and then a prayer meeting begins.





Acts 4:29-30 – "O Lord, hear their threats, and give us, your servants, great boldness in preaching your word. Stretch out your hand with healing power; may miraculous signs and wonders be done through the name of your holy servant Jesus."

Acts 4:31 – After this prayer, the meeting place shook, and they were all filled with the Holy Spirit. Then they preached the word of God with boldness.





Acts 4:32-5:11 — Generosity, Sharing, and Ananias and Sapphira

Acts 5:12-42 — The Apostles are arrested. They are released by an angel. They are arrested again. Peter said they would obey God rather than man. The Sanhedrin decided that they needed killin'. Gamaliel convinced the Pharisees it was a bad idea. They flogged them and told them not to preach.





Acts 5:41 – The apostles left the Sanhedrin rejoicing that God had counted them worthy to suffer disgrace for the name of Jesus.



Acts 5:42 – And every day, in the Temple and from house to house, they continued to teach and preach this message:



"Jesus is the Messiah."





Acts 6:1-7 – Seven Deacons are selected to handle the distribution of food to make sure the Grecian Jews and the Hebraic Jews were treated equally. These were the first Deacons. (διάκονος – diakonos)

Stephen was one of the seven.
He was described as "a man of faith and full of the Holy Spirit."

- ¹⁸And <u>do not get drunk with wine</u>, for that is debauchery, but <u>be filled with the Spirit.</u> Ephesians 5:15-18
