

V. 8b – Jesus affirms the craftiness of worldly people over people of the light, that is Christians.

Φρόνιμος – phronimos - practically wise, sensible

Matthew 10:16 – As Jesus is sending out his disciples he cautions them to be as shrewd as snakes but as harmless as doves.

- Psalm 49:11 Their graves are their eternal homes, their dwelling places to all generations
- Ecclesiastes 12:5 . . . because man is going to his eternal home





II. Crafty Ways but a Short Life - Luke 16:8b-9

When you combine the manager's goal in verse 4 with Jesus' statement in verse 9 you arrive at this extrapolation of the text:

If you want to pay people off in order to gain access to their homes, go ahead. They will in turn be there to usher you into your eternal home – your grave – and in reality, that's all you'll get.
