Proclamation - March 30, 1863


It behooves us then, to humble ourselves before the offended Power, to confess our national sins, and to pray for clemency and forgiveness.

What is an ambassador for Christ?

An ambassador for Christ is a citizen of The Kingdom of God who represents God's interests in the foreign kingdom - The World.

The primary role of an ambassador is to establish and maintain diplomatic relations between the two realms, facilitate interaction, and promote Kingdom priorities and objectives.

We are representing the Kingdom everywhere we go and in everything we do and in everything we say because when we speak as ambassadors we speak as the voice of the King.







Do not fear them or be intimidated, ¹⁵but in your hearts regard Christ the Lord as holy, ready at any time to give a defense to anyone who asks you for a reason for the hope that is in you. ¹⁶Yet do this with gentleness and reverence, keeping a clear conscience, so that when you are accused, those who disparage your good conduct in Christ will be put to shame. ¹⁷For it is better to suffer for doing good, if that should be God's will, than for doing evil.

Know who you are in Christ Jesus.

Develop relationships by doing good things for people.

Eliminate fear by trusting God to put into your mouth.

Use the "teachable moments" to share the hope that is in you. Be humble. Be gentle. Don't be holier than thou or gung-holier than thou.
