An ambassador for Christ is a citizen of The Kingdom of God who represents God's interests in the foreign kingdom - The World.

Christian Ambassadorial Duties

- 1. **Represent God and His Kingdom**
- 2. **Build and maintain relationships**
- 3. **Negotiate agreements**
- Provide information and advice
- **4**, **5**. Protect the people of God's creation
- **6.** Manage relationships within embassy
- **7.** Report back to God all things



¹³Who then will harm you if you are devoted to what is good? ¹⁴But even if you should suffer for righteousness, you are blessed. Do not fear them or be intimidated, ¹⁵but in your hearts regard Christ the Lord as holy, ready at any time to give a defense to anyone who asks you for a reason for the hope that is in you. ¹⁶Yet do this with gentleness and reverence, keeping a clear conscience, so that when you are accused, those who disparage your good conduct in Christ will be put to shame. ¹⁷For it is better to suffer for doing good, if that should be God's will, than for doing evil.

Look for "teachable moments" in everyday conversations.(15) Use "teachable moments" to share the hope that is in you.(15) Be humble. Be gentle. Don't be holier than thou or gung-holier than thou.(16)

A US ambassador provides safety and security for US citizens both within the embassy and those passing through the foreign county.

AND

Provides temporary refuge within the embassy in the form of short-term protection from physical danger when the danger is both immediate and exceptionally grave.

An Ambassador for Christ provides safety and security in the form of salvation through Jesus for all people and in so doing provides permanent refuge and eternal protection.

We must share light with all people.


People within the church are living in a world of darkness.

Within the church we must remind each other of the light that dwells within us and do the work – oil filling and wick trimming, etc. – to sustain that light. Then when we step out of the church we must carry that light into the darkness to dispel it.
